## Friday and Saturday

\* Join local knitters and crocheters in the "Knitting Circle" located on the lawn under the shade tree just outside the entrance to the Wool Village. They will gladly answer questions about their crafts and why they chose them. This is not a class, so instructions will not be given at the event. They will be on-site throughout the day as their personal schedules permit. Bring along your folding chair and sit awhile.

\* Make sure to check out all the booths inside Wool Village. Some vendors will be doing demos off-and-on each day. One booth will have angora rabbits who will be donating their fiber for spinning. Other vendors will be knitting, doing needle felting, and other fiber hobbies.
