NOSB Meeting Notice!

Public comment deadline is October 1, 2020

Are you interested in the rules of organic certification? Have your voice heard at the NOSB!

Dear PCO Certified Operators, Members, and Inspectors,

You're invited to join PCO in attending the National Organic Standards Board (NOSB) meeting, which will be held <u>live online</u> via webinar on Wednesday, October 28, through Friday, October 30, from 12:00 – 5:00 p.m. EST. Please refer to the NOSB meeting website (https://tinyurl.com/y2frfpuu) for information on how to watch the webinars, or contact the PCO office. The NOSB is a volunteer board that considers and makes recommendations to the National Organic Program on a wide range of issues involving organic certification.

The agenda for this upcoming meeting includes the items listed below. The NOSB will accept written comments on these items until October 1, 2020, and oral comments via webinars on October 20 and 22, 2020. To access the meeting materials, contact PCO for hard copies or visit the NOSB website.

At the upcoming meeting, the NOSB will be **VOTING** on:

Crop topics:

- o Whether Paper (Plant pots and other crop production aids) should be newly allowed in organic crop production
- Whether <u>Wild, native fish for liquid fish products</u> should be required to be sourced only from fish waste, bycatch, or invasive species
- Whether Sodium carbonate lignin should be newly allowed as a dust suppressant in crop inputs

• Handling topics:

- Whether <u>Low acyl gellan gum</u> should be newly <u>allowed</u> as an ingredient in products labeled as "organic" and "made with organic..."
- Whether components of <u>Ion exchange filtration</u> should be required to be listed on the National List to be permitted for use in organic processing and handling

Livestock topics:

o Whether Fenbendazole should be newly allowed for use as a parasiticide in organic poultry production

Other topics:

- Whether <u>Marine microalgae in crop fertility inputs</u> should be restricted according to specified harvest parameters
- o NOSB Research Priorities 2020
- Whether the following materials should continue to be allowed in organic production and handling:
 - Crop materials:
 - Soap-based algicide/demosser; Ammonium carbonate (bait in insect traps); Insecticidal soap; Vitamin D3
 (rodenticide); Aquatic plant extracts (fertilizer); Lignin sulfonate (chelating agent, dust suppressant); Sodium
 silicate (floating agent in post-harvest handling); EPA List 4 inerts

Livestock materials:

- Butorphanol (anesthetic); Flunixin (analgesic/anti-inflammatory); Magnesium hydroxide (antacid/ laxative);
 Poloxalene (emergency bloat treatment); Formic acid (pesticide in beehives); Excipients; EPA List 4 inerts
- Handling materials:

- Kaolin (anticaking agent); Sodium bicarbonate (leavening agent); Wood Resin (fruit wax); Ammonium bicarbonate (leavening agent); Ammonium carbonate (leavening agent); Calcium phosphates (leavening agent); Ozone(disinfectant); Sodium hydroxide (caustic bath for pretzels), Inulin-oligofructose enriched (dietary fiber); Kelp (thickener/dietary supplement); Orange shellac-unbleached (fruit and veg coating); Cornstarch (thickener); Sweet Potato Starch (texturizer for bean threads); Turkish bay leaves (flavor development); Whey protein concentrate (nutritional enrichment); Carnauba wax (fruit wax); Colors; Glycerin (solvent)
- Whether the following materials should continue to be <u>prohibited</u> in organic production and handling:
 - Crop materials:
 - Arsenic; Strychnine
 - Livestock materials:
 - Strychnine

Each survey is CONFIDENTIAL and contains about 10 short questions that will take an estimated 5 minutes to complete. Your responses will be compiled with other data from operators all over the country to better understand the use of each material in organic production and handling. The NOSB will also be discussing, but **NOT VOTING** on, the following topics:

- Crop topics:
 - Whether <u>Ammonium Extract</u> should be <u>prohibited</u> in organic crop production
 - o Whether the annotation for <u>Biodegradable biobased mulch</u> should be <u>updated</u>
- Handling topics:
 - Whether <u>Whey protein concentrate</u> should be <u>removed</u> from §205.606, which would mean that only organic forms would be allowed in products labeled as "organic" or "made with organic..."
- Other topics:
 - Human capital strategy for organic inspectors and reviewers
 - Consent calendar voting
